Future Plans

Our plans at the moment for extensions to the LMGGC site include:

- 1. More examples in the CMGG, particularly in the area of calendar-related glyphs.
- 2. Explanations in the CMGG of the iconographic origin of syllabograms.
- 3. Upgrading the level and detail of the notes for syllabograms to that of logograms / words and phrases.
- 4. Using information in MHD to replace the uncredited drawings (Coll-1 and Coll-2) in the CMGG where possible.
- 5. Extending the online CMGG to include phrases and names (presently available only in the PDFs).
- 6. More information about on which inscriptions glyphs occur.
- 7. Interactive activities to help with memorizing glyph shapes, readings, and translations.
- Improved searching and filtering including tagging of glyphs so that they can be found based on their elements (e.g. property markers), even when their pronunciation is not known.
- 9. Options to display more glyph variants at once.
- 10. Linking to publicly available papers (i.e., PDF or website), rather than just a popup of a reference to the paper.
- 11. A page to go from English to Classic Maya.
- 12. A page for detailed transliterations and translations of inscriptions, with commentary and footnotes.
